- **You need to explore more than what you think.**

Luke 18:27 (New International Version)

27 ... "What is impossible with men is possible with God."

Luke 18:27 (New Living Translation)

27 ... "What is impossible from a human perspective is possible with God."

Isaiah 55:8-9 (New Living Translation)

8 "My thoughts are completely different from yours," says the Lord. "And my ways are far beyond anything you could imagine. 9 For just as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts higher than your thoughts."

- **To experience No Limit Living we must identify there is more to life than what we know and what we are currently experiencing.**

- **Commit to explore what you lack.**

Matthew 6:33 (New Living Translation)

33 Seek the kingdom of God above all else, and live righteously, and he will give you everything you need.

Mark 10:17-22 (The Message)

17 As he went out into the street, a man came running up, greeted him with great reverence, and asked, "Good Teacher, what must I do to get eternal life?"

18 Jesus said, "Why are you calling me good? No one is good, only God. 19 You know the commandments: don't murder, don't commit adultery, don't steal, don't lie, don't cheat, honor your father and mother.

20 He said, "Teacher, I have—from my youth—kept them all!

21 Jesus looked him hard in the eye—and loved him! He said, "There's one thing left: Go sell whatever you own and give it to the poor. All your wealth will then be heavenly wealth. And come follow me."

22The man's face clouded over. This was the last thing he expected to hear, and he walked off with a heavy heart. He was holding on tight to a lot of things, and not about to let go.

• **Those who truly commit to find what they lack are determined to do something about what they find.**

• **Exploration is about who God called you to be, not about who you once were.**

Matthew 16:13-19 (The Message)

13 When Jesus arrived in the villages of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "What are people saying about who the Son of Man is?"

14They replied, "Some think he is John the Baptizer, some say Elijah, some say Jeremiah or one of the other prophets."

15He pressed them, "And how about you? Who do you say I am?"

16Simon Peter said, "You're the Christ, the Messiah, the Son of the living God."

17Jesus came back, "God bless you, Simon, son of Jonah! You didn't get that answer out of books or from teachers. My Father in heaven, God himself, let you in on this secret of who I really am. 18And now I'm going to tell you who you are, really are. You are Peter, a rock. This is the rock on which I will put together my church, a church so expansive with energy that not even the gates of hell will be able to keep it out.

19 "And that's not all. You will have complete and free access to God's kingdom, keys to open any and every door: no more barriers between heaven and earth, earth and heaven. A yes on earth is a yes in heaven. A no on earth is no in heaven.

Matthew 7:7 (New Living Translation)

7 "Keep on asking, and you will be given what you ask for. Keep on looking, and you will find. Keep on knocking, and the door will be opened. 8For everyone who asks, receives. Everyone who seeks, finds. And the door is opened to everyone who knocks.
